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Challenges – at Institutional level

- Developing appropriate SMART objectives to address the needs and a plan of action to implement these objectives
- Increasing national ownership, capacities and coordination
- Adapting VA framework into each context
- Implementing progress monitoring and reporting
- Integrating VA into national programme for persons with disabilities and in a broader context of development and underdevelopment



Lessons learned (1)

- Collaboration and coordination among ministries and/or national institutions are essential
- National ownership is a key issue
- ▶ The VA six areas constitute different aspects of **a** process, which together will ensure that victims are fully included in society
 - victim assistance should be provided through an integrated approach that includes all components of the rehabilitation chain



Lessons learned (2)

- Victim assistance should be integrated into longerterm development
 - targeting public health systems, work opportunities and social integration of survivors and persons with disability in general
- Problems faced by mine survivors are similar to the challenges faced by other persons with disabilities
 - victim assistance does not require development of new fields, but rather reinforcing existing service systems and policy framework to meet the needs of all citizens
