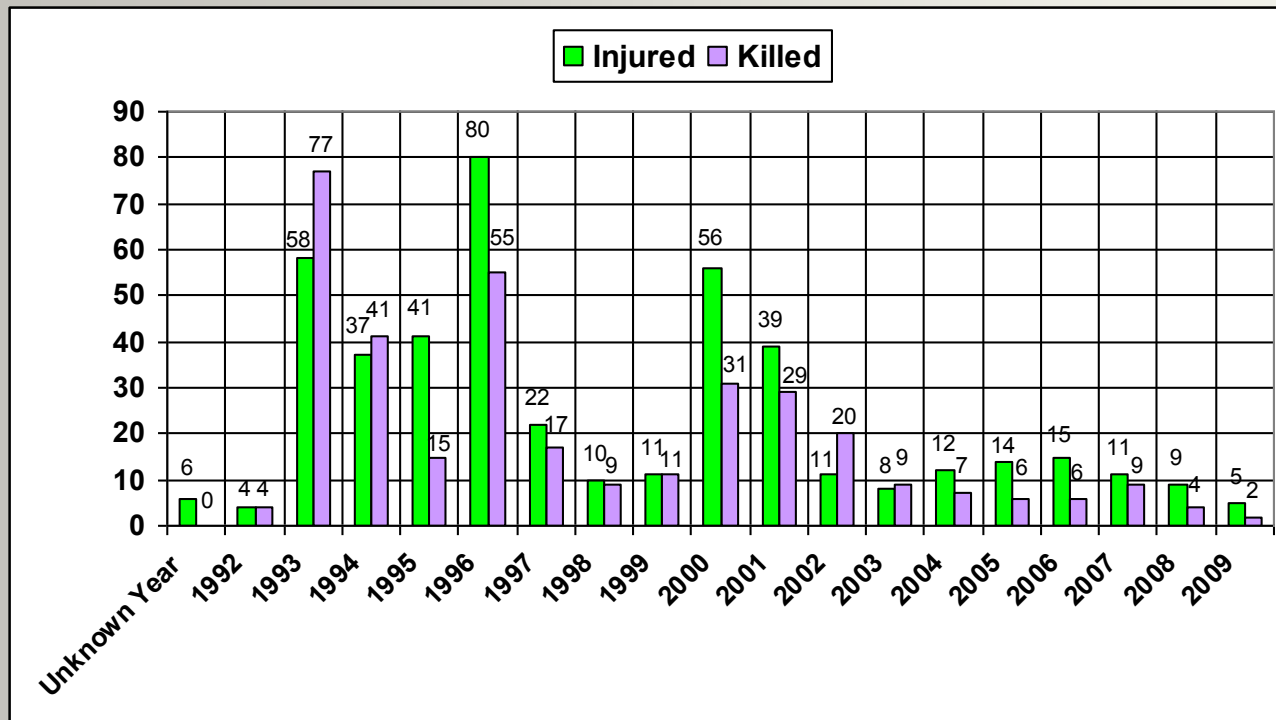

■ Needs Assessment Survey (March 2008)



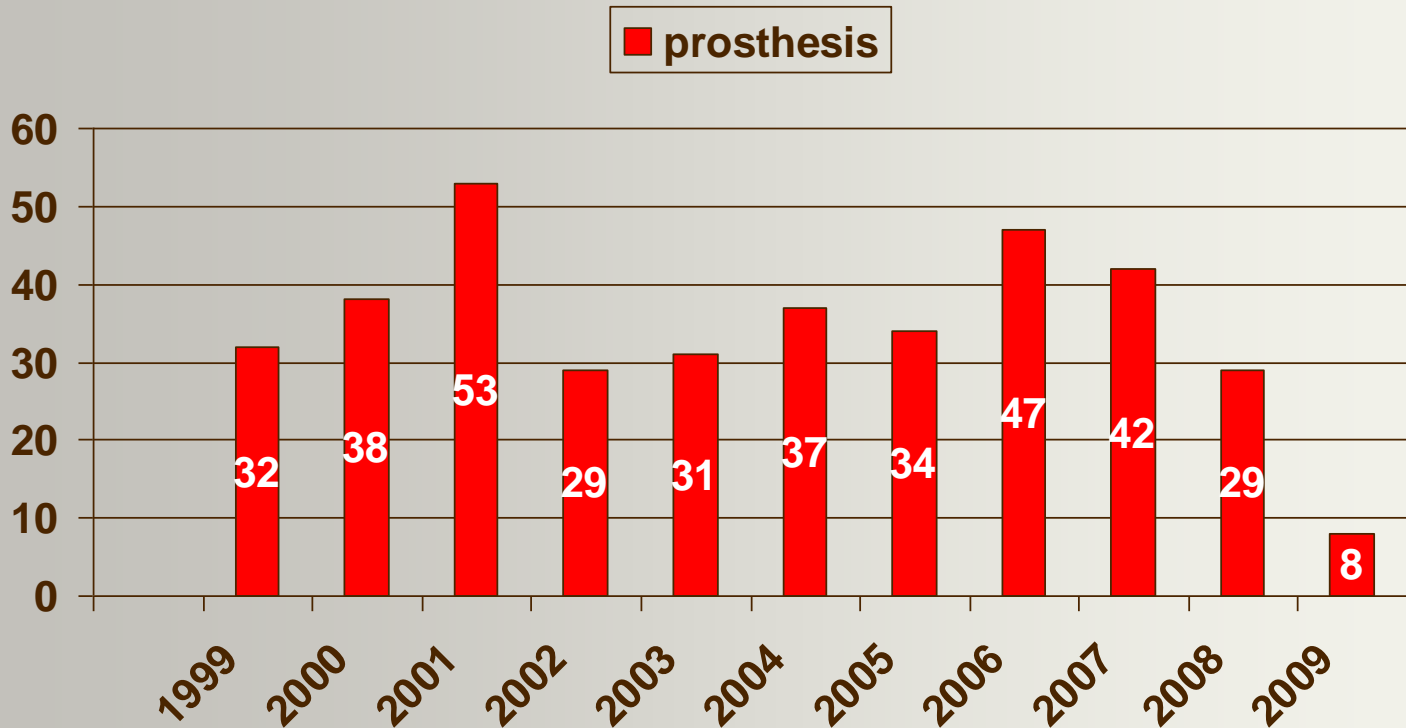
Achievements

- Provision of the emergency and continuing medical care by health facilities under the MoH
- Child rehabilitation Centre (May 2009)
- National Research Institute for rehabilitation of PwDs (NRIRD)
- Trainings on Rehabilitation (ITF, IRRS in 2007, 2008)
- Training for specialists in Kabul (Canada, 2008, 2009)



Achievements

National Ortho Center (NOC) was handed over to the MLSPPP by ICRC (1 January 2009)



Achievements

- Training course on “Team building and communication skills with landmine survivors”
- Guideline “Psycho-social assistance for the landmine survivors”
- Summer camps for survivors



Achievements

1. **Special boarding school for young PwDs in Dushanbe**
2. **236 victims - received different means of IG from 2005 until July 2009:**
 - **Animal husbandry – 145**
 - **Bee-keeping – 69**
 - **Individual IG projects – 22**
3. **138 survivors prepared for the future assistance to start small animal husbandry in 2009**

Achievements

- Tajikistan has legislation protecting the rights of PwDs
- At the present time CRPD is under the consideration of the Government of RT
- New version of the Law on Social Protection of PwDs from 1991, developed by MLSPP and is under the consideration of the Ministries

Challenges

- Lack of Funding for the implementation
- Poverty and lack of the economic developments
- Services not meeting the needs in terms of both quantity and quality
- Limited of awareness of survivors about their rights and the services available

Priorities for the 2010-2014

- Resource mobilization and long-term sustainability
- Increasing of accessibility to quality services
- Implementing capacity development and training plans
- Increasing of survivors' awareness about their rights and the services available
