- **National Implementation Measures**  
"Emergency Law No. 12/1951 on Fire Arms and Explosive has entered into force since 1 September 1951
- **Total Stockpiled APMs owned by Indonesia: 16,581**
- **APMs retained: 4,978**
- **Location of Mine Areas: None**

- **709 mines**

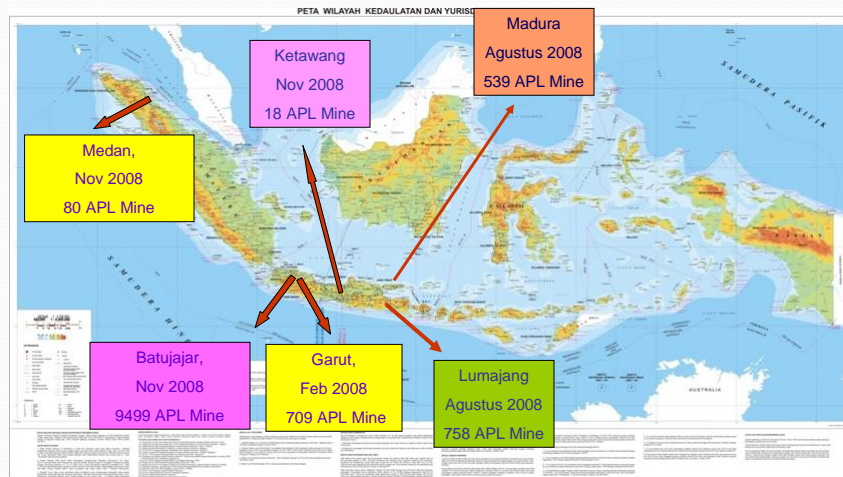
#### Phase II

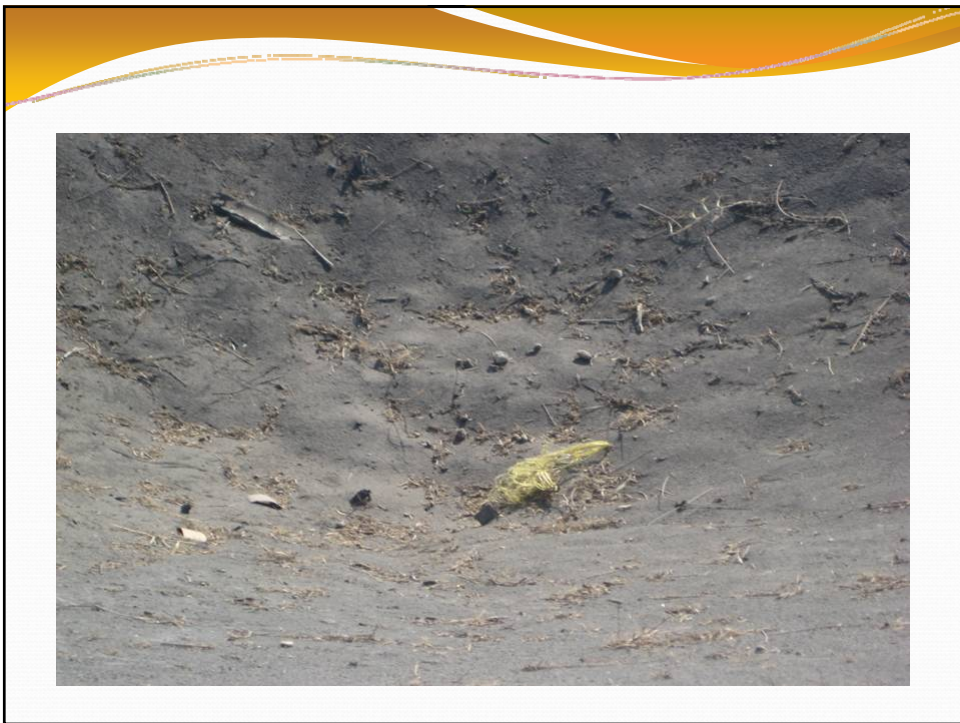
- 7 August 2008, in Lumajang and Madura, East Java
